
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

Positive Children, Positive Behaviour for Schools

This is an invaluable short course for anyone working with children in school. It promotes a series of strategies and techniques to promote positive behaviour which have been used on projects across the UK in a wide range of environments including some where behaviour has been extremely challenging.

Looking at behaviour from the perspective of the child and unpicking exactly what children are trying to communicate with their behaviour gives us a unique capacity to support the child towards pro-social behaviour. Growth Mind-sets and Resilience

Carol Dweck's theory of Growth and Fixed Mindsets turned everything we understood about supporting learning and development upside down. No longer are our feedback systems, goal setting processes or motivational strategies going to be able to stay the same. The psychological theory of Mindsets explores the development of a growth mindset and how that positively affects children's learning and development both within tasks and for their future health and well-being. This session supports practitioners to develop a healthy approach to learning themselves using reflective techniques to explore the potential fixed elements that can influence their own growth. This understanding is vital as the most powerful tool we have when supporting a move to a growth mindset is modelling. Powerful practitioner's that can understanding and model a growth mindset can and will instil a growth mindset within our children from their earliest years which will enhance long term outcomes for all learning and development. Practitioners will be supported to understand the key elements that can be implement in their daily practice including reviewing their current methods of interaction with the children. The session will guide practitioner how to approach activities and opportunities with the ability to support the child to unlock their potential. Having a growth mindset from the outset will support a child's resilience, protect them from mental health issues and enable them to approach life with motivation and a 'can do' attitude that will help them fly.

Inspiring Training for Midday Supervisors to Transform School Lunchtimes

The decline of play at home has meant that play in school lunchtimes has become increasingly crucial for children's mental health and well-being. Play deprivation symptoms such as aggression, poor social skills and anxiety are becoming more common and as play is one of the key criteria for healthy brain development it is vital that children are given time, space and resources to do so.

Benefits to children of improved play at lunchtime

- Cognitive developmental benefits
- Improved self-esteem and resilience
- Improved problem solving and creativity
- Increased levels of physical activity even in children not predisposed towards sport
- Combating play deprivation symptoms (aggression, anxiety, poor communication)

The Lunchtime Training Programme

4 unique training sessions to dramatically improve lunchtimes.

There are 4 sessions each between 2 and 3 hours in duration. Schools can purchase any of the sessions individually but it is recommended that session 1 is delivered first as this underpins all the subsequent sessions.

Session 1 – The vital role of the Midday Supervisor and How Positive Play changes children's lives

This session details the increasing importance of play at lunchtimes and how positive play can underpin a broad range of development in children and support their emotional wellbeing for the whole school day. The training highlights the role of Midday Supervisors in supporting play and gives a series of strategies for improving lunchtimes. Staff teams increase in confidence and recognise the value of their role within the school. The training also introduces inclusive practical activities to use at lunchtimes with children. The session is informal and very easy to access for even the least confident lunchtime supervisors but gives a solid grounding in play with a knowledge equivalent of a level 3 qualification.

Session 2 – Positive Children - Positive Behaviour

In this session we look at the profound impact adult behaviour has on children's behaviour and how positive adults can affect every aspect of a child's emotional well-being. We discuss the behaviour midday supervisors should be exhibiting to support our children to have positive lunchtimes. We then look at approaches to maintaining and supporting positive behaviour through a series of methods and strategies uniquely suited to the lunchtime environment. The course also gives solid approaches to dealing with negative behaviour without risking emotional damage to a child. Staff will gain confidence to support positive behaviour and effectively challenge negative behaviour whilst questioning and understanding how their own behaviour impacts on children at lunchtime. The session also looks at how we can support children to overcome school anxiety.

Session 3 – Making Play more Exciting

Overprotecting children has now been included in definitions of Emotional Abuse on Safeguarding training and is recognised by the HSE as damaging children's development. This practical session looks at what we can do in the lunchtime environment to avoid overprotecting children and at the same time protect our children from injury. The session discusses how adventurous or exciting play can help children develop physical and emotional resilience and is directly linked to positive mental health and a child's ability to cope in the real world. The session then looks at common sense approaches to risk and introduces a dynamic risk assessment procedure for ongoing realistic assessment of danger. The session also looks at the current culture of overtreating insignificant injuries and how we how we can minimise this and still protect ourselves from litigation or parental disapproval. The session also introduces a range of exciting play opportunities for children – all of which are low risk but give children a little bit of their childhood back.

Session 4 – Magical Inclusive Lunchtimes – Imagination, creativity and Divergent Thinking at Lunchtime

This practical session looks at the role of imagination and creativity in the development of children and how we can maximise this unique developmental process at lunchtimes. The session showcases low cost or free resources that can have a dramatic effect on the levels of innovation and creativity at lunchtime and help make lunchtimes a vibrant and exciting time

for children. We look at the role of the Midday Supervisor in supporting imaginative play and highlight a series of activities to delight our children. The session also looks at inclusive play and

how we make sure disabled children have positive magical lunchtimes with some wonderful inclusive superhero themed games for children. The session finishes with a look at the very real "villains" in a child's life who go out of their way to make a child feel worthless, scared and anxious. Sometimes children need a hero to step up make them feel special despite their behaviour or attitude. Sometimes all it takes is one midday supervisor to be that hero.

Extras

Classroom staff sessions

In order to help classroom staff support the lunchtime staff we can deliver a short familiarisation session either at a staff meeting or inset day. This brings class room staff up to speed with the latest developments in play theory and also gives ideas for implementing into curriculum work. This can also be delivered as a full day or half day inset session.

Supervised Lunchtimes

The course tutor can informally observe lunchtimes alongside the lunchtime staff to get a better understanding of the issues facing individual schools. This also demonstrates to lunchtime staff that the tutor is not merely classroom based and is willing to help implement the methods taught. (Free with training sessions)

Parents Training session

This hugely successful session introduces parents to the benefits of play and encourages them to provide more positive play experiences for their children outside the school. Many parents have become more supportive of the school after the training and have made important changes to family life to support their children's play needs. Our parent sessions were a finalist for a nursery World Award in 2015. Parent sessions last between 2 and 3 hours.

The Play Champions Programme

Intensive Play Training Course to radically improve Play opportunities for Children

The Play Champions programme is a 5 session intensive training programme designed to embed positive play firmly in the ethos and delivery of the school and to enable the school to advocate for play and promote positive play in its community. The training takes a detailed look at the theories, neuroscience and therapeutic benefits of play and introduces a huge range of experiences that demonstrate these theories and can be used directly with the children in the school. Crucially the course also details how to get the message across to parents and the wider community and how to encourage play in the home with an entire session dedicated to delivering a vibrant parent workshop to engage and educate local parents. The courses inspires learners to become proactive and passionate advocates for play with a firm grounding in current research.

Play Champion status is awarded to learners who successfully complete the course and deliver a follow up session for parents of children at their setting. This session can be supported by the tutor if required.

The course has been designed and adapted to meet the needs of a wide variety of settings including special schools, afterschool clubs, nursery settings and childminders and is appropriate for any agency working with children of any age and ability level.

The sessions

- 1. Introduction Theories and neuroscience of play, learning whilst playing and the catastrophic effects of Play Deprivation.
- 2. Play and the Imagination Play for Communication and Social Development, EAL and building the creative brain. Experiences rather than "activities"

- 5. The Play Champions Techniques for delivering sessions. The Play Audit and assessing play potential within a setting. Micro presentations to group.

Costs
