

Training Details

Costs are per course (not per person) and we can accommodate as many learners as your venue will hold. We are just as happy working with small intimate groups or large conference style events. The costs are the same whether you choose a course from this booklet or ask us to create a course just for you. You can even pick and mix elements from different courses to create your perfect staff training day. Training can be scheduled for daytime, twilight, evening or even weekends to best suit your needs.

To Zoom or not to Zoom?

Almost all of our courses can be delivered as face-to-face or live Zoom sessions. These are not your typical online sessions though. We have gone out of our way to ensure our online courses are just as entertaining and vibrant as our live sessions. We have high-quality lighting, cameras and sound and have created unique versions of our courses specifically to be delivered online. Just like our face-to-face sessions they have received incredible feedback and are exceptional value for money.

Costs

Courses are charged at £475 plus travel per course for a half day or £850 plus travel per course for a full day for up to 40 learners. For larger groups the cost is £650 for a half day and £950 for a full day. If the journey time is over 4 hrs in total, then we may charge the higher rate for a half day course (£650) and in some cases for very long journeys (over 6 hrs travel) will need to charge the full day rate even if the course is a half day. It is also helpful for our trainer to have a hotel for the night before when there is a long journey and this is usually around £80.

Ben Kingston-Hughes also delivers inspiring keynotes at regional, national and international conferences – please contact us for pricing and availability.

Travel

Travel costs are charged at 45p per mile from the individual trainer's location. If travel time is excessive then we will charge the full day rate for a half-day session. Online courses incur no travel and can be a really cost-effective way to access quality CPD.

It gives realistic common-sense strategies for managing risk, without overprotecting, and transparent approaches to assessing danger. Boisterous Play for Under 5's

Rough and tumble without the tears for boys AND girls!

Children are constantly told not to be so rough and yet by restricting this kind of play we are in danger of restricting their physical development and resilience. Boisterous Play is not negative behaviour but a vital way in which children test, explore and ultimately learn their own physical abilities. We have all worked with a child who doesn't seem to know their own strength and can often inadvertently hurt other children (and staff). Rather than restricting this child from boisterous play current research now tells us that this child needs more boisterous play as it is one of the key mechanisms for developing awareness of physicality in the first place. Boisterous is important for developing balance, proprioception and vestibular senses is an essential developmental process that we restrict at our peril. This course highlights the importance of rough and tumble and boisterous play and demonstrates a series of incremental activities to increase rough and tumble play in a play setting. This course is ideal for any setting wishing to make play more exciting and is especially valuable for settings where older children appear bored with the everyday activities and their behaviour deteriorates.

Positive Children, Positive Behaviour

This is an essential course for anyone working with young children. Play Champion status is awarded to learners who successfully complete the course including a Play Champions medal.
